TELUK KEMANG BEACH CLEANING

On 30th Sep 2022, Project Smile successfully gathered 93 volunteers to participate in a beach cleaning event at Teluk Kemang Beach, which is situated at Port Dickson, Seremban. Teluk Kemang Beach is located between the 7th and 8th mile of Port Dickson and famous for its comfy fine sands. Project Smile volunteers were glad to have the chance to conduct a beach cleaning activity at Teluk Kemang Beach that publicly recognized as the largest and most popular beach in Port Dickson.





As reported by Fauziah et al. (2021), 1930 plastic items can be found in every 1-meter square area of Malaysia beaches. Also, Hu (2020) highlighted that there are 3.5 million people in a year get sicked when contacted with polluted water during swimming.

"Plastic wastes and debris are major contributors to marine pollution that led to public health risk and inhibit tourism development of a country."

Plastic pollution not only killed sea turtles but also altered the temperatures of the sand where incubation occurs and eventually reduced the reproduction rates of sea turtles. Plastic waste estimated to have killed up to 1,000,000 seabirds annually. Scientists believe the number of seabirds who have consumed pieces of plastic will grow from 60% to 90% by 2050 (Reddy, 2018).



BEACH CLEANING

The volunteers were divided into groups of 9 persons where they have to compete to collect the most rubbish. The rubbish that was collected included plastic packaging. polystyrene food bottles. containers. glass beverage cans, and cigarette butts. Eventually, Group successfully collected a total of 21.4 kg of rubbish and waste and won the first prize in the competition. With all the joint the volunteers efforts. successfully accumulated a total of 135 kg of rubbish on that day.
